I recently heard a story that really hit home when I'm looking for God in the wrong place. If you're looking for God as some divine vision in the clouds, you may be missing God's transforming power coming through the person standing next to you. The story I heard goes like this;

He had only one eye and his arm was almost torn off dangling by a thread. But this little girl loved her teddy bear known to her only by the name "Bear". She made a point to take Bear almost everywhere she went including her weekly attendance at Sunday School. In her class each week they always took time to pray to God for particular groups or individuals in need. This week her teacher suggested the class pray for those who were sick and hurting so the little girl prayed for Bear. While others were praying for hungry children around the world, sick relatives, and broken relationships, the little girl hugged her bear and asked Jesus to make her bear better.

By accident, the little girl left Bear behind. Overhearing the little girl's prayer, one of the teachers took the bear home and "healed" him. She replaced Bear's eyes with shiny new buttons, sewed his arm back on, and created some new clothes for the bear. When the teacher gave Bear back to the little girl on the next Sunday the little girl had only one thing to say, "God heard my prayer"!

What the little girl would later learn is that sometimes God heals directly and sometimes God heals through others. Broken limbs and eyes, tattered clothes, or shattered lives God can show up in many ways. God is alive and well ready to fix things around us in the most unexpected ways. Pay attention and be ready to say thanks!

Volunteers are needed beginning at 7am to cook & prepare the food, volunteers are also needed to pack & hand out the meals.


Breakfast starts at 8 AM - Brook will provide further instruction on Saturday.
