#### **Pastor's Corner**

Rev. Mark Hinchcliff December 9, 2020

"In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God." John 1:1

Growing up as a young child and all the way to adulthood, one of my favorite activities was visiting the local Planetarium. There were regular programs highlighting newly discovered stars and scientific facts about our galaxy and what lies beyond. But my favorite was a special program about the Christmas Star and the origins of certain traditions both Christian and other faiths. The program always began right after Thanksgiving and ran through the second week in December. It was free but limited to a small number of seating so my family always got there an hour early to stand in line. If we made it in my family and I considered it an early Christmas gift. We waited anxiously for the start of the show after we were assured a seat.

The show began as you peered up at a domed ceiling discussing traditions of the Christmas Tree, Christmas lights, Hannukah, and other traditions surrounding the Season. It was there that I first learned that December 25<sup>th</sup> probably wasn't the actual birth of Christ but rather a date surrounding the victory of Light over darkness, the Winter Solstice. It was the Church that decided on that date because the Winter Solstice marks the longest day of darkness of any time of the year and the planetary shift back across the sky towards the Sun bringing new life.

The Christmas tree was chosen as a symbol of sustained life even in the dead of winter. At the Winter Solstice an agricultural festival, which was celebrated by burning the evergreen trees, became the tradition of decorating the trees with lights. Jesus is recognized in Scripture as "the Light of the World" by bringing that "New Life" and so became the Christmas celebration.

Most Biblical scholars believe Jesus to be born in late April or May because of the reference to the birthing of newborn lambs in the fields which normally happens in the Spring or Summer of the year. The program then switches to a focus on the Christmas Star and the

night sky is projected on the ceiling and rolled back in time to exactly what the sky looked like over Bethlehem at that time. The scientist, in conjunction with the Bible, believes the most likely answer is the alignment of two planets and a star which happens only once every couple of hundred years. In addition, the Maji, or Three Kings, were astronomers who were accustomed to spotting unusual changes in the sky giving explanation to their discovery that others missed.

Jesus, known as the Living Word of God. According to John 1, was not only with God at the beginning of all time, but was God! Christmas is not only a beautiful tradition to celebrate but the World's chance to honor God and new life each year. Let's all join in.

Half of the Christmas Joy Offering is distributed to the <u>Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions of the PC(USA)</u>. The other half of this offering provides leadership development and education at <u>Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color.</u>

The <u>Special Offerings of the PC(USA)</u> are celebrations of specific ways God has been made known to us. Each is connected to a season of the church year and mandated by the General Assembly to help the whole Church join together in response to God's grace. They represent the largest, collective way Presbyterians come together to work for a better world. The Offerings actively engage congregations in ministries of compassion, justice, hunger, Christian formation, education, peacemaking and global witness. We join other congregations in making an impact on the world.

Each year during the Advent and Christmas season, we turn our eyes to Bethlehem and celebrate the wondrous gift of Jesus Christ, our Savior. How may each of us honor God's perfect gift of his Son? What a loaded question to ask during Stewardship season! With all that God has given to us, how do you respond? How can you respond to the Love of Christ as you give and receive any and every gift this Christmas season?

Let us ask the Lord to teach us how to best respond as we read the Bible and pray for one another. God has blessed the Church with incredible leadership in every time and place. We need each other and your giving, participation and feedback is a gift! Leaders often need to be supported by their communities as well.
