Pastor's Corner

Rev. Mark Hinchcliff December 16, 2020

"Let this be a sign among you, so that when your children ask later saying, "what do these stones mean to you?" then you shall say, "because the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord; when it crossed the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off, so these stones shall become a memorial to the sons of Israel forever." Joshua 4:6-7

Around my neck I wear two different designs of crosses, and a medallion of half a heart. Each were gifts to me from members of my family. The medallion reads, "Together or apart, God is with us". I think I can count on one hand the number of times in thirty-five years that necklace has ever been off my person. I don't wear it as jewelry, I wear as a means of remembrance to tell the story of what each piece means to me. On my right wrist is a bracelet comprised of fishing leaders. This is a reminder of a spiritual leadership event called the "Walk to Emmaus". The bracelet reminds others around the world to identify other believers in Christ and to tell the story of God's presence then and now.

Christmas this year, 2020, is a time of remembrance of the fresh hope that the birth of Jesus brings to us all in the gift of a fresh start on life and relationships forever. One of my favorite traditions is bringing the family together to decorate now two trees each year. What may take no time for some to decorate a tree, may take our family days to complete. You see we all take turns carefully unwrapping each ornament which sparks one of us to tell the story of what memory each one evokes. If one may have been too young at the time to remember that story, it has now been passed on to the next generation when we're gone on to be with God.

The Holy Scriptures, like the memories of our lives, are just waiting to tell the stories to new listeners so the Word never ends. God's Word as we've seen during the pandemic will never be silenced and neither should your witness to those memories. Joshua 4 remembers the story of God's chosen crossing the Jordan on dry land into "The Promised

Land". Stones were left behind to memorialize the tribes of God's promise. But without the story, those stones are just rocks. Without your story of God's presence in your lives, your life may go unnoticed. In your actions or in your speech tell your story today.
