While looking through some materials from a Youth retreat that I had previously led, I found a birthday party invitation for Jesus. The invitation read like this;

You are cordially invited to a birthday celebration.

Time: Whenever you're ready! Try not to be late.

Place: In your heart. (He'll meet you there. You'll hear him knock.)

Attire: Come as you are. He'll be cleaning you up anyway.

Gift Suggestion: Your promise of commitment and trust.

That last line particularly struck me because we are the ones receiving the gift instead of the birthday boy! When was the last time you went to a party and not expected to be the one to give but rather to be the one to receive?

Or when was the last time you had a birthday and didn't get any older, just newer and fresher?

Christmas should be a time of renewal and celebration of God's greatest gift of life to the world. Jesus comes as a newborn to represent a fresh

start without any history of bad actions on our part. Forgiveness and a clean slate are offered on our behalf bringing hope for a better future. Shouldn't that be something we celebrate every day instead of once a year? Don't throw away this invitation.



Sunday, January 10, 2021 Congregational Meeting to vote on the approval of the pastor's terms of call.


