**Devotional Meditation Elder Monica Stevens December 8, 2021** 

Come and Worship! Luke 1 & 2

It seems that everywhere we go, we are surrounded by sights and sounds that are particular to the holiday season leading up to Christmas. Even without young children at home I still love to see reindeer, Santas, brightly wrapped packages, Christmas trees, decorations, lights, wreaths, and uniquely decorated Christmas sweaters. I never tire of hearing the music of the season as it fills the air in stores, on the streets, and across the air waves. I enjoy all of the cultural trappings of the holidays, but what I most long for goes much deeper than candy canes and tinsel.

I long to hear Isaiah calling our across the centuries: "The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light...For unto us a child is born..." "Arise, shine, for your light has come." I want to hear the angel Gabriel announce the coming births of John the Baptist and Jesus and feel the surprise, wonder, and awe that Elizabeth and Mary felt. With Mary I want to lift my heart and my voice to proclaim God's goodness and faithfulness as I ponder the coming birth of God's Son. I want to stand with Zechariah when, for the first time in nine months, he is able to speak and he praises God and prophesies the coming of our Savior and the role his own son will play to prepare the way for Jesus. I don't know how I could do it, but I would love to fly and sing with the angels, but also be a shepherd startled from my sleep by the angels' song. I long to visit the manger and kneel before the infant King, knowing that I was somehow seeing the fulfillment of my deepest wishes, and then running back to my flocks, and shouting the good news for all to hear as I went.

In my quiet moments of meditation and prayer I can think on all of these things, but I realize that outside of Gabriel's announcement to Zechariah and then to Mary, none of these acts took place in solitude. Mary had Elizabeth for the Magnificat; Zechariah had his crowd of friends and family when he uttered the Benedictus when John was born. Of course the angels had the shepherds who, once they heard the news, visited the Holy Family for themselves, and then spread their news to anyone in earshot. The great, good news of the season is meant to be shared and experienced in

community. God acts, and we respond. In each instance above, those touched by what God had done responded with their worship and praise.

From the very beginning of time, God has reached out to creation in glory, majesty, righteousness, faithfulness, mercy, and love. Humanity appropriately responds to God with humility, praise, adoration, contrition, supplication, faithfulness, love, and service. This is the grand pas de deux, the eternal dance of God with humanity. This is the essence of worship. God leads and we follow. God acts and we respond. God calls and we answer with our joys, concerns, and service. God offers himself and we humbly receive the gift of God's presence with us, Emanuel. It may just be my perception, but it seems that during the seasons of Advent and Christmastide, God and all the heavenly host seem much closer, much more accessible. It feels as if the whole creation is straining with us toward the coming of the Christ Child.

Through worship we experience the holy mystery of God's presence with us, and we in turn offer all that we have to praise, honor, and glorify God. God calls us to join together in worship with Zechariah, Mary, the angels, the shepherds, and all of God's children throughout the ages to lift our hearts and voices in longing, wonder, and praise. God's love and glory is meant to be shared and lived together in God's presence. As the last verse of Angels from the Realms of Glory encourages us:

All creation, join in praising God the Father, Spirit, Son,

Evermore your voices raising to the eternal Three in One;

Come and worship, come and worship, Worship Christ the newborn King!

Worship with us as we honor and praise God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit!

Alleluia! Amen.


The church office will open for limited appointments. Please call to schedule. Please enter at the narthex for Sunday worship and during the week use the back door at the portico.


community will be featured, along with beautiful Christmas trees on display.

## **From the Transition Team**

When Pastor Mark retired on August 31, our church began the process of finding a new pastor. A Transition Team, made up of Monica Stevens, Denny Casey, and Joan Montgomery was appointed by the Session's Administration Committee. In an effort to keep the congregation informed we want to tell you the work that has been done and the work to be done.

- The Transition Team met with Carl Utley, our General Presbyter, on 9/16/21 for training.
- Responsibilities of the Transition Team are:
- 1. Identify and recommend to the Session a candidate for Interim Pastor;
- 2. Identify Transitional Priorities for Interim start up;
- 3. Consult staff and elders about needs from Interim Pastor;
- 4. Complete the Presbytery's Ministry Information Form (MIF) and seek appropriate approvals. The MIF describes our church in location, membership,

- mission statement, narrative questions, and top 10 Leadership Competencies, salary range, and basically what we are looking for in an Interim Pastor;
- 5. Work with the Interim during transition as requested by Interim; and
- 6. Communicate to congregation about transitional process.
- We were charged with interviewing staff and session members for what they wanted professionally and personally in an Interim Pastor. That has been completed.
- The Transition team met several times to consolidate the interview responses and to complete the MIF.
- The Ministry Information Form was approved by the Session at its November meeting and has been sent to the Presbytery for approval.
- Upon approval, candidates will be identified based on matching our needs with candidate applications.
- The Transition Team is waiting for a date from the Presbytery for our second training on interviewing candidates for the Interim Pastor position.

Although the process seems slow, even to us, we want the congregation to know that the process is moving forward.
