Pastor's Corner Rev. Mark Hinchcliff June 30, 2021

"As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all that you do; for it is written; "Be holy because I am holy" 1 Peter 1:14-16

I never knew how much my life would have to change until I pursued a career as a Special Agent for the Federal Government! Not only did my past have to be squeaky clean, but my family, the friends I kept, even the extended family I had married into, had to pass that same clean background test that I did if I were to have any chance of being approved. After a year and a half of testing and multiple interviews, I had to voluntarily give up three years of income tax returns for scrupulous audited examination. While the audits were taking place, other federal Agents were canvassing my neighborhood conducting random interviews questioning those who may or may not know me about my personal character. All of this just to determine if I could be considered worthy as a candidate.

Although when I went into inquiring about becoming a Special Agent, I felt pretty good about being an honest upstanding guy. But having others examine every aspect of my past life to determine a possible future life starts to make one question every decision you ever made. And if I had to account for every misstep I took, was there enough grace in the world to survive? Well to this day I credit my faith in God as the grace I needed, that anyone needs, to survive such an ordeal.

To read a piece of Scripture, like the one above from 1 Peter, who could stand if God would make all of us account for every time, we fell short? To have God say, "Be holy because I am holy", and stand as our judge, be unachievable without God's grace. Our faith is a small price to be seen as worthy. But obedience through a sincere desire to change and follow God's example can move us to be better. Not perfect, just better. Holiness means to set aside for purity. Holiness is the everyday business of every Christian. It shows itself in the decisions we make and the lifestyles we live, hour by hour, day by day.

Some people never strive to become mature believers. The first step to holiness is to be obedient. It won't be easy but look at your response to the life you have been given by God. If your response in the past wasn't the best, ask for God's forgiveness and do better in the future. The result just might be a deeper and fuller life closer to God's plan for you. Jesus said it like this, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled". Be grace-filled in your days to come.
