Dear First Presbyterian family,

This week Betty Hudson's son was visiting from north Georgia, reminding me of home. My parents spent much of their life together in Ellijay, GA. The winding mountain roads of north Georgia were home. There was one turn, in particular, where my yellow lab always - yes always - got sick. It was just part of going home. Home, the only place I got red meat and vegetables, according to my dad.

In the mountains, each change of season brings a totally new landscape. It was a struggle to get home during fall, because of all the leaf watchers. And yes, my dog got sick when the going was slow too. But while fall brought loads of people to a quiet forgotten area, my mom always appreciated the varied shades of green announcing spring and flowing into summer. Perspective influences and enlivens the colors of our world. Perspective is our spiritual journey.

Some spiritual teachings suggest that in a single bloom, or leaf or even a blade of grass, we can see the whole world. I've read of monks who walk the same path every day, always finding something new \sim seeing anew with the eye of their heart. Julian of Norwich, saw the whole world in a hazelnut:

"And in this he showed me a little thing, the quantity of a hazel nut, lying in the palm of my hand, as it seemed. And it was as round as any ball. I looked upon it with the eye of my understanding, and thought, 'What may this be?' And it was answered generally thus, 'It is all that is made.' I marveled how it might last, for I thought it might suddenly have fallen to nothing for littleness. And I was answered in my understanding: It lasts and ever shall, for God loves it. And so have all things their beginning by the love of God.

In this little thing I saw three properties. The first is that God made it. The second that God loves it. And the third, that God keeps it."

With the passing of the holiday weekend, we enter a summer of vast shades of green, new growth, new life, and a different pace. The days are longer and as the heat comes, life slows down. Our thoughts, our perspectives, on time and temperature can change with the seasons. In this and all seasons may we allow God to help us see the whole world in the beauty of God's creation ~ both nature and God's people. In this and all seasons may we know our true home, with God.
