Pastor's Corner

Dear First Presbyterian family,

God says to First Presbyterian, "Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it (1 Cor. 12:27)." God says the same to Grace Presbyterian, Forest Hills Presbyterian, First Collinsville, and all the other churches. We are all unique in our diversity and united as one. And together, with all churches, we are the body of Christ. And the body of Christ is in each of us.

Sometimes our spiritual understandings are beyond rational thinking. It's humbling and overwhelming to try to comprehend all that God is, all that Jesus is, and all that the Holy Spirit is. Christians have been trying for centuries. And while we never really understand, seeking understanding grows the peace in our hearts \sim growing our connection to God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit.

I'd like to share something from Symeon the New Theologian, a Greek Orthodox abbot and poet who lived around 949-1022. There are many theologians, including modern ones, who suggest that poetry is our best attempt at finding words of understanding:

We awaken in Christ's body as Christ awakens in our bodies, and my poor hand is Christ. He enters my foot, and is infinitely me.

I move my hand, and wonderfully my hand become Christ, becomes all of Him (for God is indivisibly whole, seamless in His Godhead).

I move my foot, and at once He appears like a flash of lighting. Do my words seem blasphemous? – Then open your heart to Him

and let yourself receive the one

who is opening to you so deeply. For if we genuinely love Him, we wake up inside Christ's body

were all our body, all over, every most hidden part of it, is realized in joy as Him, and He makes us, utterly, real,

and everything that is hurt, everything that seems to us dark, harsh, shameful maimed, ugly, irreparably damaged, is in Him transformed

and recognized as whole, as lovely, and radiant in His light we awaken as the Beloved in every last part of our body.

May we be utterly real and Beloved, Pastor Bea
