Well, Back2School is close upon us and we are in full steam ahead getting ready to take care of the little ones in our community. As in years past, we are part of the "City Cluster" of Martinsville as we join our church friends from First Baptist, Starling Ave. Baptist, Broad Street Christian, First United Methodist, Holy Trinity Lutheran, Christ Episcopal and Integrity Life Church in providing new shoes, socks and backpacks for all children that register from Pre-K through 12th grade.

This event that will take place on **August 1**, keeps on getting bigger and we are proud to be a part of this mission. However, we need your help to be successful. As in previous years, you have the opportunity to sponsor a child for just \$20. That will provide the backpack and shoes and an extra pair of shoes for a child overseas in a poverty-ridden community. This year will look very different, though, with dealing with Covid-19. But we are determined to move through and help the children that will need our help more than ever before. Many folks are laid off and with the added burden of that along with getting their kids back in school; you can imagine the stress level of many families in our community.

Another opportunity to help is providing socks for the kid's new shoes. Since we are not in church each Sunday, it is difficult to collect items, so we will be glad to purchase socks if you would like to give a monetary donation for that. You can just add that to your sponsorship or as a separate donation.

The actual registration and event will also be very different as this we will be a curbside for both. We will not be able to wash the children's feet and connect like we have in the past, but we have some things that we are working on to make it just as memorable. We are working with the schools to get the word out to the families and we hope that we have a great turnout. Our City Cluster goal this year is to serve 300 kids. The location for the event will still be at Albert Harris Elementary and we will setup drive up stations for foot measuring by paper and issue appointments.

Although we will not need as many volunteers as before, we will still need volunteers

to provide the service. If you are interested in volunteering for this event, please let me know and I can answer any questions you have. Social distancing and precautions will be in place for safety.

So, please consider supporting this mission and join me in prayers for all our endeavors in reaching the kids that need it the most. If you have a child or a grandchild in your family, you probably know how difficult it has been for them to get through all of the changes in their lives. But, when you think of a child in our community that is in a home that is poverty ridden, unloving and possibly abusive you know that our work is precious. Thank you for your support, your heart and your generosity!

Their manner of life should be a demonstration of the Christian gospel in the church and in the world" (PCUSA Book of Order G-2.0101, 2.0104)

Discerning God's Call

As we seek to identify those who are called serve, consider the following characteristics, skills and commitments to the life of faith and the ministry of the church:

- Regular attendance in worship
- Participation in church activities
- Cooperative, with ability to work with others
- Willingness to learn and be open to new ideas
- Conscientious, with ability to follow through on tasks
- Demonstrates a Christian spirit in dealing with others
- Commitment to the government and discipline of the PC(USA)

Ruling Elders: Elders should be "persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit." (Book of Order G-2.0301) We are seeking 3 persons to serve a full 3 year term, class of 2023.

Trustees: Trustees exercise responsibility "to receive, hold, encumber, manage, and transfer property, real or personal, for the congregation." (Book of Order G-4.0101)

We are seeking 2 persons to serve a full 3 year term, class of 2023.

Each term runs from January through December.



The church office and facility remain CLOSED. For the safety and health of our staff, please stay home. Even though we are in Phase 2, folks aren't supposed to be in the building until things are officially opened. Even then guidelines will have to be followed. You will be given notice when you can return. Thanks for your adherence and understanding.

The code to enter FPC has been changed. If you have need to enter the building and do not have a fob you will need to call the office and set an appointment time with a staff member. If you wish to have a key fob please call the office and leave a message. By having a key fob it will allow us to know when someone enters the facilities. We are trying to be proactive about disinfecting areas if we know someone has been there.

Anyone entering FPC must use the back door at the portico. All other doors are to remain closed with no entry. You are required to wear a mask to enter. Please help us to maintain a COVID-19 free facility by staying home if you are sick or have been in contact with the virus in the past 14 days.

Church COVID - 19 Response Team Update

Our church response team has been working since March to discern the Word of God, learn, plan, and to advise the session and congregation as to best practices in dealing with the pandemic and our church community. In the works are draft reopening guidelines, checklists, and a summary of tasks and duties that will need to be performed in order to reenter the building safely and responsibly.

We are going to need volunteers to: prepare the building; clean and disinfect surfaces; and, act as health and safety screeners for services. We are preparing a detailed list of duties and a checklist but wanted to let everyone know where things stand and what we're working on. Stay tuned for more updates and in the coming weeks the session will be providing more information and direction. Until then, serving God, the health of our church family, and the safety of our entire community are our highest priority.


Materials & Supplies: The week before VBS, families will receive a list of materials and supplies that you will need for VBS. These are items you will likely have readily available in your household.
