Pastor's Corner Rev. Mark Hinchcliff June 2, 2021

"From him the whole body, joined together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work." Ephesians 4:16

As a Type 1 Diabetic of over 30 years, I have seen the long-term effects of the daily battle of managing the sometimes out-of-control blood glucose on my body. I inherited a family predetermined tendency towards the disease and watched my mother die at age 52 in a diabetic coma. Although scientific treatment advances over the last 35 years have been significant, like cancer, a cure is no closer. One of the long-term effects of the disease is poor circulatory functions and an added risk of tendon tears and muscular breakdowns. I have been plagued with these tendon tears, and the surgeries associated with them, all over my body. With each tear temporary disability in one area causes another area to strengthen.

As I age, I must admit that although I have survived, I long for the days when everything worked together at the same time. It's like replacing a broken part on an automobile only to have two more breakdowns. But one part supports the other and all must work together to operate at its best. The Scripture quote from Ephesians 4 seemed to me to parallel the Christian life and my own life of health, breakdowns, repair, and restoration. No Christ-follower is an island unto themselves. Spiritual health requires constant attention. And when a breakdown occurs, it may take a team to make a repair. Don't believe me? Try operating on yourself next time without assistance from another. We're better together.

Christianity while requiring an individual's personal faith commitment is not an individual faith by nature. Christianity is designed to be lived out in the community, not in isolation. We are born out of the Father's will, sanctified by Jesus's death and resurrection, and empowered by the Holy Spirit. We all have a role to play as members of the Body of Christ. And when the body is torn apart, it's those tendons or ligaments as the Scripture says that rejoin together for the body to rebuild itself.

We can rise above our own weaknesses and challenges when we support one another to accomplish what God has called us to be. I look at all the evidence of the scars that life has inflicted on me but I am reminded by those scars all the people it took to put my body back together. I am also reminded of what Jesus did for me to love me through the pain by surrounding me with caring believers for a better tomorrow. Give thanks to God today not only for health and prosperity but also for the scars along the way!
