"The Lord our God is righteous in everything He does"

### **Daniel 9:14**

"Righteous". When you hear that word what does it mean to you? Do you hear a positive meaning as in "doing the right thing" or do you hear negativity as in "acting self-righteously, only doing what benefits you"? As a Christian, "God's righteousness" means God's character is to always do the right thing. We look to God's direction and actions in the Living Word (Jesus), the Written Word (Scripture), and Holy Spirit to guide us in what God considers righteous.

That being said, when I hear of demands to do the "right thing" by raising awareness of racism by peaceful protest, that turns violent, that sparks blanket hate against the very group we're now asking to restore order and provide protection, it may be hard to discern what the "right thing" is in God's eyes! Even people of deep faith may be questioning, "Where are you God in these horrific actions and what would you have us do?" In many cases we can't hear God's answer when we won't stop telling God what God needs to do. Doing God's will comes about, in most cases, by responding in obedience to that charge given by God. Divine will may come from our inspired action from the Almighty.

So when people are at risk or dying from an unseen virus, when attempts to save lives causes restrictions at home or loss of jobs, when loss of livelihood cause poverty and hunger, and when all of this coupled with historical wrongdoing cause frustration, anger, and rage, where do we go for the right answer? We go to God and listen for

His direction. And when you get that direction, speak the convictions put upon your heart and listen to others who may have different direction than you and let God put us all together with kindness and understanding.

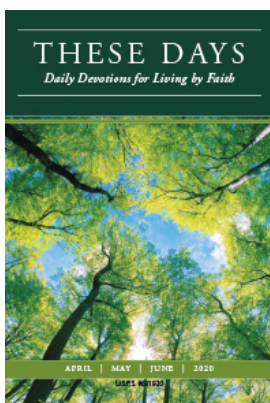

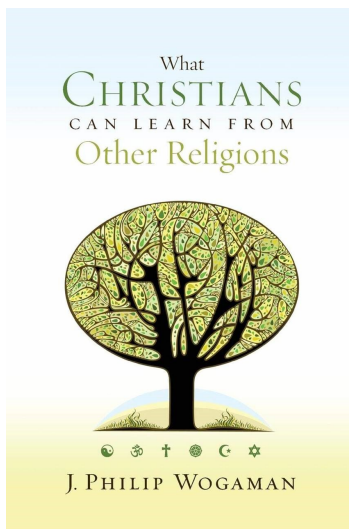


## Youth Sunday School
