Pastor's Corner Elder Monica Stevens

"Sing praises to the Lord, O you his faithful ones, and give thanks to his holy name. For his anger is but for a moment; his favor is for a lifetime. Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes in the morning...You have turned my mourning into dancing; you have taken off my sackcloth and clothed me with joy, so that my soul may praise you and not be silent. O Lord my God, I will give thanks to you forever." Psalm 30:4-5, 11-12 (NRSV)

Last night storms rolled through our area complete with thunder, lightning, gusty winds, heavy rain, and possibly even some small hail. Every pet we have ever had has been at the very least, uncomfortable during mild storms, and terrified to the point of shivering, cowering, and trying to hide during the more violent storms. I am usually pretty calm during storms, but I have to admit that storms with high winds worry me and make me anxious until they pass. Storms at night amplify my nervousness because I can't see what is going on outside. I keep a close eye on the weather radar, but I admit that the sounds of the wind whipping through the trees and the rain pelting down on the house sometimes cause my imagination to run wild.

This morning when I woke, the only remnants of the storms were the leaves, oak catkins, and small branches littering the ground, and the jewel-like orbs of water hanging from the leaves on the trees and the telephone wires. The sun was shining, the clouds had disappeared, wind was calm, yesterday's pollen had been scrubbed from the air, and the birds were singing and foraging for food as if nothing had happened in the night. Meditating on the contrast between the concerns of the night and the joy and relief of the morning caused Psalm 30 to pop into my head. (portions quoted above)

Most of us would probably prefer to skip the storms of life and bask in the calm of sunny, uncomplicated days, but alas, that just isn't the way life works. Anyone who is human experiences not only good times, but also bad times. It often seems that the good times are too fleeting, and that the difficult times occur too often and stay too long.

The author of Psalm 30 was no stranger to difficulties in life, but knew that even in the deepest, darkest, hardest times life had to offer, God was there to answer his cries for help. The psalmist called on God for help and God answered, turning his fear into joy and praise. Psalm 139 is another of my favorite Psalms. It assures that God is always with us no matter the place or the

circumstances we find ourselves in. There is no place and no circumstance where God cannot find us, surround us with God's love, and care for us in our hour of need.

It is easy for us to envision God with us in the calm, sunny times, but it is more difficult to feel that assurance when we are made anxious, threatened, unsure, and afraid by the storms of life. God, speaking to Israel, and by extension, to us invites us to trust and rest in God's love and care with these words, "Don't fear, because I am with you; don't be afraid, because I am your God. I will strengthen you, I will surely help you; I will hold you with my righteous strong hand." Isaiah 41:10 (CEB)

Sing praises to the Lord, O you his faithful ones, and give thanks to his holy name! Amen.
