Dear First Presbyterian family,

Pentecost is our season. The wind and fire of the Spirit are making us and everything new. The Spirit brings the gift of what seemed impossible and unimaginable. We are in the midst of becoming the First Presbyterian family that God is calling us to be. We are no longer the church of our memories, but the foundation of our past has readied us for a new time, a new way, a new life together. "Pentecost is the moment when gestation ceases and birthing occurs. Thus, it is both an end and a beginning, the leaving behind of that which is past, the launching forth into that which is only now beginning to be. Pentecost therefore is not a time of completion. It is moving forward into new dimensions of being, whose basic forms are clear, but whose fulfillment has yet to be realized." (Walter Brueggemann, Texts for Preaching, Year B, p. 347)

Our time is now, to make things new that never were. It is an earth quaking, time of new language and new understandings. We've participated in Adaptive Change Workshops, Purpose Labs and now our Think Tank. The Spirit is on the move! Walter Brueggemann, my Old Testament professor, places great value in words and their power to communicate and transform. He wrote this prayer in *Awed to Heaven, Rooted in Earth: Prayers of Walter Brueggemann:*

To make things new that never were

We name you wind, power, force, and then,

Imaginatively, "Third Person."

We name you and you blow....

blow hard,

blow cold,

blow hot,

blow strong,

blow gentle,

blow new....

Blowing the world out of nothing to abundance, blowing the church out of despair to new life,

blowing little David from shepherd boy to messiah, blowing to make things new that never were.

So blow this day, wind, blow here and there, power, blow even us, force,

Rush us beyond ourselves,

Rush us beyond our hopes,

Rush us beyond our fears, until we enact your newness in the world.

Come, come spirit. Amen.
