Dear First Presbyterian family,

Jesus loves beyond the rules: eating with outcasts, healing on the sabbath, turning over tables in the Temple, forgiving the seemingly unforgiveable. Jesus, as the enfleshment of God entering human history, shows us that the essence of God is love  $\sim$  abundant, generous, beyond belief love.

We all know that sometimes love is given in rules  $\sim$  like the 10 Commandments. We first learn love through rules lovingly given by our parents: don't touch the hot stove, look both ways before crossing the street, use your words. Rules are important.

When Jesus loves beyond rules, he is allowing relationships and connections to grow. It is the love of Jesus that connects us to each other and to God. Eating with outcasts, Jesus brings people into community. Healing on the sabbath, shows us that God is always healing us and the world. God's ability to heal is not constrained by our human expectations and limitations. Turning over the tables, reveals that God's house is not a place for profit ~ or a place that separates people by what they have. And forgiving the seemingly unforgivable, is the grace and love we all need to reconnect to others and to God. God's love is our foundation as Jesus fills us with all the love we can possibly receive. It is this immense love that enables us to live as beloved children of God, created in God's image to reflect God's love in the world. Beloved children of God, following Jesus ~ this is who we are!
