## Pastor's Corner

"Be still and know that I am God! I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." Psalm 46:10

Prayer labyrinths have been used in different ways throughout the world for generations. I myself became aware of them at a Presbyterian retreat center in Texas known as MO Ranch. MO Ranch, especially during the Summer, is a virtual beehive of young energy and excitement. With all that activity around you might think it would be hard to find the time or place for meditative communing with God. But God's presence abounds around every corner, and one of the best places for that is a huge labyrinth in the woods by the river.

Prayer labyrinths are a series of mazes that do not offer dead ends, wrong turns, or endless complications. Instead, they offer a chance, while walking through, to focus on the journey of our lives past, present, and future.

The MO Ranch labyrinth offers intermittent stops where one might meditate on major crossroads of one's life and where you saw God active in those times. As you enter the maze, the hope is that the details and distractions of life can be released and one's heart can be open to God. As you journey to the center, your focus now turns to receiving a word from God about choices from the past and a way to make ready for a charge to the future. Once that meditation and prayer to God happen in the center, the journey back is a joining of hearts with God and a charge for the days to come.

The Psalmist in Psalm 46 writes about a time in his life where distractions, noise, and chaos seem so overwhelming that its difficult to function. Sounds familiar, doesn't it. In these days of uncertainty, it's time for us all to be quiet and listen for a word from God. Slow down. Stay in prayer. And know how to commune with God by giving your heart to the Almighty.

**Announcements**

**Our first in-person worship is planned for October 4** at 10:00 a.m. We will not, however, offer Sunday school or youth programs. The nursery will not be open. All children must remain in the sanctuary with their families. Communion will be celebrated. Individual wafer and juice sets will be provided for each person and will be located in the pews.

**Opening Soon But We Need YOU!** We have set a tentative re-gathering date of Sunday, October 4, in person 2020 but we still need volunteers! As we prepare to reopen parts of the building, we are still in need of your help. If you are healthy and are not at-risk, please consider volunteering. Below you will see brief descriptions of some of the main responsibilities:

**1. Building Team** - will prepare the building by posting signs, closing off open spaces and rooms; taping off some areas of the building; the sanctuary and restrooms will be marked for physical distancing

**2. Cleaning Team** - clean and disinfect before and after services; work with staff to make sure all the commonly touched surfaces and furnishings are cleaned regularly

**3. Screeners** - screen congregants as they enter the narthex; check temperature by using a digital thermometer; communicate health guidelines and best practices; facilitate use of hand sanitizer dispenser; provide masks and gloves as need

**4. Ushers** - welcome congregants and work with screeners on Sunday morning to assist with safe distancing and seating; prepare collection plates, count offerings, deposit collection; take names of everyone in the service. More detailed descriptions will be provided with a checklist for each area.

## Grace Network

*Hi, Friends*

*As the Director of Grace Network, I wanted to give you an update what we are doing for our community. There are so many of you that support Grace in many ways and we are grateful. Each month this summer from the time we had to close down due to ofCovid in March, we have been phasing in our services gradually to create the safest environment we could possibly have in order to protect our clients and our volunteers. We are now open 5 days a week serving clients by appointment and as of this week, we have reopened our food pantry. During the summer, we were part of the food box distribution program sponsored by the Harvest Foundation and the Henry County Food Bank, but for September, we decided it was safe enough and we had enough volunteers willing to come back that we were able to open our food pantry back up with our regular service there. We are also working with the City of Martinsville to help those facing cutoffs or evictions due to the pandemic with funds granted to us by the Cares Act from the state. We have been able to help over 300 households with over \$44,000 in assistance either from the Cares Act or our funds from the community through Grace Network just this summer. We will continue to work with our community partners to help our clients find resources as we move to better times. The unemployment rate for Martinsville is back up to over 15% which is worse than the rest of Virginia at about 9%. So we continue to struggle in our community, but I for one am very proud of the resources that are available in helping those in need.*

*Your contributions to our pantry will be most important as we move forward and we continue to be grateful for the monetary support from First Presbyterian Church. I wanted to let you know that your donations are being used well and wisely and are changing the lives of those suffering. The assigned item for FPC moving into October will be Peanut Butter. We appreciate your donations. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate in contacting me.*
