






FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR

A "Death and Life" Situation

"Christ died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them...So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" 2 Corinthians 5:15, 17

In cases of critical illnesses, disasters, or accidents, people often speak of someone being in a "life or death" situation. The reactions and responses of the person his/herself, emergency personnel, and health care providers are said to make the difference between survival or death. Over the past few weeks, there has been much conversation surrounding decisions made and directions set by the Session at their March 17th meeting. It was a special meeting called not only to consider and review the current deficit operating budget, but also to prayerfully consider the larger issues of our mission and ministry as a church in this time and place. Some people, in receiving the Session's letter, may have wondered if our church is in a "life or death" situation. There have been many concerns shared and feedback received. The process of listening and sharing in this time is not only important, it is a sacred and faithful conversation as we together seek to discern God's will for us going forward.

I have found rich meaning and connection that these conversations have been taking place during our holiest of seasons in the Church: Lent, Holy Week and Easter. For the very issues we are struggling with – confusion, fear, loss, uncertainty – are so powerfully present in the experience of Christ and his disciples in those final days. In fact, to the eyes of the crowd, the authorities, and even his own disciples, Christ's passion and crucifixion was a "life or death" situation, and it looked like death won. But to everyone's surprise, on Easter morning the situation was turned on its head. The powers of sin and death were ultimately broken, and life - not death - was God's triumphant Word. Christ's death and resurrection

through times of confusion, fear, loss, and uncertainty, trusting that a new creation is being born in us, in our very midst. Through Christ, we can move beyond the crisis of a "life or death" situation, to a situation where everything is being made new. And living in the promise of the resurrection we must hold together the "death and life" situation at the heart of our Christian witness.
