"Are any of you are suffering hardships? You should pray. Are any of you happy? You should sing praises." James 5:13

I love amusement parks! I love everything about them from the rollercoasters, to the theme rides, to the comfort foods, to the smiles on children's faces. You might say the catchphrase of one of the most famous parks of its kind, Disneyland, "The Happiest Place on Earth" describes my affection to a T. It would be hard for me to have a bad time even when some difficulties have happened in the past. One time I locked my keys in the car before I ever got in the gate but rather than postponing my fun AAA was called unlocking my car, charging my account online, and leaving my keys at the will-call booth on my way out. Another time in the midst of my joy in the park I forgot to put on sunscreen and suffered pretty severe sunburn. But again, it didn't stop me from coming back for a second day. No matter how much of a happy place you might find yourself in you can look around and see suffering still happening around you.

Isn't life just like that? Wherever your happy place is, with family or loved ones, walking on the beach, experiencing sunrises or sunsets, someone else may not be having as good a day as you are. We cannot escape suffering in some form or another no matter how hard we try. As much as we want to be, Christians are not exempt. When Scripture in the Bible talks about suffering it speaks of the "human condition" common to us all. Sometimes suffering can be used for correcting, but other times suffering can be to God's glory. Sometimes suffering can be used to build an individual's character, and other times we may suffer for another's benefit. And sometimes we just don't understand why we suffer.

If there's one thing I truly believe, it's that God wants us to experience true joy in the life we have been given. Since everyone suffers, we are called to consider how we respond to it. Like Job, instead of trying to get into God's way only to stay positive and seek God's direction from who's really in control. Maybe you feel your life is in a season of hurt or suffering and like Job you may not know why. Your job, our job, is to turn back to God for help through it. And maybe, your joy can continue even through suffering.

May the grace of God give you peace.
