The Martinsville Community Collaborative is a wonderful annual event that is sponsored by Liberty University College of Osteopathic Medicine, Averett University, Virginia Dental Foundation and many community partners. This event provides a day of medical, dental and resource services for anyone in our community that is underserved. This is the 5th year of helping our community connect with medical and dental services and to provide the ability to connect them to a medical home with many insurance

options. This particular day, all of the services are free of charge and anyone is welcome to come. No appointment needed

The event will take place on Saturday, November 2, 2019 at the Uptown Ministry Center behind Rania's Restaurant from 8-3pm. There will be over 100 medical, nursing and dental students and faculty to provide these free services. We are looking for friendly people to serve by escorting our clients throughout the clinic.
