## Pastor's Corner Pastor Bea Miller

Dear First Presbyterian family,

When people we love are in pain, it is difficult to know how to respond ~ or even how to pray. We can never really *know* the pain of others. We may be able to come close with empathy and compassion but no matter how much we try to walk in someone else shoes ~ it is not our journey to make. Our journey of empathy and compassion is to stand with, to sit with, to be present with our loved ones who are in pain. We need not say anything, presence is a comfort ~ like knowing Jesus is with us. When we are present in moments of pain, the Christ in us touches the Christ in others. The touch of Christ always brings healing.

And when distance prevents us from being physically present, our prayers are the touch of Christ too. Words are not necessary. God knows those for whom we pray, better than they know themselves. Our inescapable God is already in them and with them. Praying for those in pain can be as simple as sitting in God's love, saying, "God, I love you and I'm here to pray," as you hold an imagine of a situation or a person in your heart. In contemplative prayerful moments like this, the heart of Christ in us and the heart of Christ in those for whom we pray, opens the path toward healing ~ even at a distance. It is the love of God that connects us, no matter the distance.

Openhearted, contemplative prayer is what Paul describes in Romans 8:26-27, "The Spirit helps us in our weakness for we do not know how to pray as we ought, that very Spirit intercedes with sighs and groans too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God." This scripture affirms that the Spirit takes all the sighs and groans from deep within us, all that is beyond our words, and molds all of it by God's will  $\sim$  God's will for us and for those in our heart. And then the Spirit whispers everything that we are too pained to name  $\sim$  and that we do not even know to name  $\sim$  into the ear of God. The Spirit prays for us. In a broken and fear-filled world, the heart of Christ  $\sim$  the heart of the Spirit of our Living Lord  $\sim$  connects and heal us.

May all hearts know the healing of Christ,
