The Harrison Museum of African American Culture: Revealing the Past to Illuminate the Future

A visit to the **Harrison Museum of African American Culture (HMAAC)**, located inside Roanoke's Center in the Square Building, is an opportunity to learn about the rich history of African Americans in the Roanoke Valley and beyond, while developing an awareness and appreciation of their significant contributions. The museum houses a collection of memorabilia, photographs, and objects, as well as a collection of oral stories and recollections told by elders to feature the culture and importance of the valley's black communities. Art in African and contemporary styles are both an important part of the museum's permanent collection.

The Presbytery of the Peaks awarded a Community Outreach Block Grant to the Harrison Museum to support the museum's goals and beliefs: Ensure that an inclusive history of the Roanoke Valley is told. Promote and embrace cultural diversity in the Roanoke Valley. Inspire our youth by informing them about the accomplishments and contributions of the African American community. Foster a research venue that collects and preserves historical and future art and documents significant to African and African American culture. Collaborate with community organizations to provide a rich arts venue in the Roanoke Valley.

Now is a great time to visit the museum, which sponsors the annual Henry Street Heritage Festival each September, recognizing and celebrating the rich culture and heritage of people of African descent. To learn more, visit


