(1 Corinthians 3:11-14)

I heard a story of a carpenter, known for his expert craftsmanship and on the verge of retirement, was coaxed into building one last home by a wealthy client. The carpenter was so ready for retirement that he made plans to cut corners and finish the house early with less than his usual quality put in! He used inferior products and didn't feel the need to insure that every detail was inspected to insure his usual degree of perfection. When the house was finished, the outside looked wonderful but the carpenter knew of what lay underneath. Although the project was finished in record time the carpenter felt guilty delivering a product that was not up to his usual standard! On the day the wealthy client was to take possession of the home, the carpenter received a word from the client, saying "I'm aware of your reputation as a superior craftsmen builder. I know how hard you have worked for me and other clients throughout your career. So I wanted to reward you at your retirement. I am

Session Highlights for Stated Meetings

July 28, 2014

- Elders-elect Denny Casey, Cindy Edgerton, Victoria Esarey, and Janet Fentress were examined by the Session and their examination was upheld.
- The Pastor's severance package was reviewed and revised since Jenny Spivey has obtained a position in Virginia Beach as a Temporary Supply Pastor.
- The Session approved changes to the Manual of Operations for the Nominating Committee.
- The meeting was concluded with prayer at 8:50 p.m. with gifts and words of thanksgiving from the Session to Jenny as she moderated the last Session meeting of her ministry with FPC.

August 25, 2014

- Mark Hinchcliff moderated his first Session meeting for our congregation.
- Pastor Mark led the Session in devotion, an opening prayer, and a low-ropes challenge.
- A motion was approved to appoint Mary Lewis Johnston and Kelly Huff to serve as both teachers and co-directors of the Weekday School.

- The Session was informed of the October 19 barbecue picnic on the front lawn of the church, sponsored by the Fellowship and Congregational Care Committees. The cost will be \$5 per adult, \$3 per child, \$20.00 maximum per family.
- A motion was approved to create a policy of no unauthorized use of the playground from dusk to dawn, due to recent night-time activity. The Facilities Committee will research the mounting of a motion detector light.
- An ad hoc committee will be appointed to research signage and an informational church sign for the church.
- The Session approved the serving of communion on the first Sunday of each month and on Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, and Maundy Thursday.
- Nancy Moore was elected as Commissioner to the Presbytery meeting in October. Cindy Edgerton and Pearl Minter are alternates.
- The Session approved calling a Congregational Meeting for Sunday, September 7 after the 11:00 worship service to elect Billy Kirby as trustee to fill the unexpired term of Anne Abercrombie, who resigned.
