Setting an Example at Any Age

Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but rather set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity.

1 Timothy 4:12

Being young in both Biblical and modern day terms can mean a variety of things to different people. Young can mean young in age, young in experience, young at heart, young in appearance, or even childlike in our response. The Scripture from 1 Timothy is referring to Timothy who was the youngest of the disciples. Many of the elder disciples may have looked down on or dismissed the spiritual maturity of Timothy simply because of his physical age. Timothy was believed to be in his early to mid 30s when these words were addressing him. Timothy's physical age may have been older than Christ himself in his primary times of ministry. So why did the first disciples, like so many in the church today, feel justified to only to recognize maturity by age?

Spiritual maturity knows no physical age! Some of the most advanced in their spiritual walk are our own teenagers right here in the community. 1 Timothy 4 tells us never to let another belittle you because of your age, but rather set the example for the believers! Be the role model who leads by example, acting out of kindness in



your speech, living a life worthy of the calling, loving one another, following Christ's example, having faith in Him. Have patience in one another the way God has had so much patience in us.

As we move forward in this community ministry in Martinsville we will all make mistakes. May we learn to respect, forgive, and learn to mature in our faith, never assuming any superiority over another. The Lord has already proven our worthiness for

forgiveness and salvation on the cross. Let us be moved into a grateful reaction by the Spirit daily in our lives.

Dick & Willie Trail Service Project March 14


