#### **Stewardship or Generosity**

Let's consider stewardship versus generosity. Stewardship is used primarily in a church environment, yet it applies to our entire life. It recognizes that everything we have is God's and we are simply managing those resources while here on earth—our wealth, possessions and physical bodies. Often stewardship is associated with the giving of time, talent and resources. Attention is usually focused on the tithe or pledge and stewardship becomes associated with supporting the church financially.

Generosity on the other hand is associated with giving freely to others. Generosity is giving something away freely and without beneficially obligation. It focuses on the spiritual qualities of the giver, derived from the generosity of God, rather than on the church's need for money.

So between the two, one feels more like an obligation and the other is a choice. Yet both stewardship and generosity involve giving. Are you more willing to give because you want to help someone or do you feel obligated to give because it's part of the stewardship of your resources? Or can it be both?

Stewardship to First Presbyterian Martinsville—should it not also be generosity? We should give but also we want to give.

Soon each family will receive a letter requesting financial support for our church as well as a gift of time and talents. As we look toward commitment Sunday on November 1, please think of your stewardship with the church but also think of your gifts with generosity.
