

Dear First Presbyterian Family,

Just as each year travels through a cycle of seasons with a variety of moods, activities, and opportunities, so does the church year. We will soon enter the season of Lent which starts on Ash Wednesday (March 1, this year) and leads up to the celebration of Easter or Resurrection of the Lord Sunday (April 16).

Historically, Lent has been a time of simple living, prayer, repentance, and fasting to grow closer to God. It lasts for forty days (not including Sundays) commemorating the forty days Jesus spent in the

wilderness after his baptism getting ready for his public ministry. In modern times, fasting has become giving up something enjoyable—a favorite food, favorite activity—or giving up something that will lead to being a better person—a bad habit, negative behaviors.

As part of your Lenten observance you may wish to "fast" from certain things to help you focus on becoming more Christlike, however, we are asking that our church family take on the discipline of a common devotional study during Lent using the same booklet. As you read the short scripture lessons and devotional messages, you will hear from 47 different people who relate Jesus' story from their own experience with him.

It is our prayer that as we participate in *Meeting Jesus* in our homes, we will grow together as a community of faith deeply committed to knowing, loving, and serving Jesus so that others may meet Jesus through us.

A Tribute to John Brown

Editor's Note: Our dear friend John Brown entered the Church Triumphant on February 14. Arrangements are still incomplete at this time.

I first met John when I joined the Praise Band for the contemporary service to the church. I was impressed with his skill as a percussionist. I could tell he really enjoyed playing and appreciated the opportunity to share his talent. When people asked him why he chose to become a member of First Presbyterian Church of Martinsville, he would say that it was more like the church he attended in New York City where he grew up. He regularly attended the adult Sunday



School class and would stay for the 11 o'clock service every week. He was the liturgist one Sunday.

Another passion he had was being a member of the Veterans Honor Guard. He

was in the army at one time. He loved putting on the Honor Guard uniform and participating in the ceremonies honoring former military people at their funerals. He had not been able to participate for the last few years because of his health problems.

The praise band members grieved with John when he lost his mother a couple of years ago. He inherited a very special cross that had been his mother's. John donated the cross to the chapel service where it has been on the communion table ever since.

John was an "expert" when it came to kidney dialysis. He was on dialysis three to four hours a day two times a week for over 12 years. He did not feel very well the rest of the day after his treatment, but when we had to move rehearsal to one of those days, he still managed to come. He told me that he would instruct other dialysis patients about how to handle bad weather or power outage if it prevented them from having a treatment. He enjoyed being the "teacher" for new patients.

I have been impressed with how welcoming our church members had been to him. He was of a different race and social-economic class than the rest of us, but everyone seemed to enjoy having him be a part of our church community. I think he felt as if we were his family.
