Pastor's Corner

Following the Christ Child

Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but to the interests of others.

Philippians 2:4

A famous psychologist, Dr. Karl Menninger, once gave a lecture on mental health and was asked during a question and answer segment, "What advice would you give to someone who felt a nervous breakdown coming on?" Without hesitation Dr. Menninger replied, "Lock up your house, go across the railroad tracks, find someone in need and find a way to help that person." His point was that, when we become so focused on our own problems and circumstances, we can become withdrawn and inwardly frozen, which may effectively remove us from active participation in the life that God has given us. This will prevent us from ever being what God intends for us to be, including serving others effectively. We can freeze in our own tracks!



Following Christ is not an exercise of protecting our own interests but rather a grateful response of our hearts for what God has already done for us. We respond by reaching out to others and lovingly serving them in God's holy name. When I look back on tough times in my own life, times when I have felt sorry for myself for some reason or another, I've experienced release from my anxiety by changing my focus to others and getting myself involved in serving. Routine self examination is healthy. An obsession with self is not.

As we enter the event of Christmas and into the New Year, be reminded that our gift from God in the Christ child has

already been given to us as believers and followers of Him. So today if we find ourselves frozen in our tracks by a difficult situation, shift that focus from ourselves to Jesus and find someone to serve in His name. Receive the gift of life that God gave us in the Christ child and start the New Year by sharing His gift focused on the life of another! The weight will seem lighter and we can get moving once again.
