Devotional Booklets Available This Sunday "Jesus and the Prophets"

The Christian Education Committee is providing Lenten devotional booklets to anyone who wants one. This year's devotional is "Jesus and the Prophets," written by Rev. Jimmie R. Hawkins, who works for the PC(USA) Office of Public Witness in Washington, DC, and is a former pastor of Grace Presbyterian in Martinsville. It is illustrated by Steve Burgess, a Presbyterian artist from upstate New York. It includes a short devotion to set the tone for each week and then daily devotions which include scripture passages, a meditation, and a prayer. Our members are encouraged to



find a time when they can share these devotionals with family or friends as part of the observance of the season of Lent. The devotional booklets will be handed out at both services on **Sunday, February 18**, and will be available in the church office after that. Anyone who is not able to come to the church but wants a copy of "Jesus and the Prophets" may call the church office (632-3431) and we will get one to them.

Congregational Outing

Caverns at Natural Bridge Sunday, February 25, 12:30 PM

Everyone is invited to join us on a trip to the Caverns at Natural Bridge. Meet in the church parking lot at **12:30 PM**; bring a bag lunch and money for admission. Children 6 and under: free; Ages 7-17 (and college students): \$12; 18 and older: \$18. If we have enough people, we'll take the church bus.

The caverns were discovered just before the turn of the 20th century and opened to the public in 1977. Visitors enjoying the Natural Bridge Caverns tour descend more than 34 stories deep within the Earth to get to the magnificent natural display, including the Colossal Dome room. This room is an enormous dome-shaped natural feature that was created over thousands of years. Walking from the dome room, visitors can see other places while on the 45-minute tour of the Caverns, such as Mirror Lake, the Well Room, and the stalactites and stalagmites that grow from the Canyon Room.
