



Let's Beat Plastic Pollution!

Did you know that single-use plastic is a huge threat to our oceans and marine life? Plastic takes up to 400 years to decompose, meaning it stays in our oceans for a long time, posing a threat to sea turtles and other marine species who mistake plastic for food. Globally, people dump about 8 million tons of plastic into the ocean each year—equivalent to a dump truck load every minute.



Microplastics are another problem—small pieces of plastic that are broken down from larger pieces, which get eaten by plankton and fish. Eventually these microplastics travel up the food chain and get to us.

It has been predicted that by 2050 there will be more plastic, by weight, than fish in our oceans.

This year, people are focusing on taking action to beat plastics pollution. The easiest way to do that is by cutting down on single-use plastic—plastics that are only used once before being thrown away. These include plastic bags, stirrers, straws, utensils, cups, dishes, and more. Together, we can do our part to save our oceans and our planet. Let's use less plastic and connect to Earth together!

Here are some suggestions you can take in your daily life to reduce your use of unnecessary single-use plastics:

- Use washable dishes and silverware instead of single-use plastic.
- Switch to reusable shopping/grocery bags.
- Bring your own reusable mugs to take away beverages or reusable containers if you're taking out food.
- Refuse plastic straws—reusable silicone or stainless steel straw are now available and come with little cleaning brushes.
- Write to manufacturers urging them to reduce plastic packaging.
- The more, the merrier. Encourage your friends and family to do the same!
- Try coming up with your own examples—share it on social media with #BeatPlasticPollution and #Connect2Earth! (World Wide Fund for Nature).
