
Time for GPS! Monday, September 10, 3:00-5:00 PM

What Is a Blessing Box?

A recent *Presbyterians Today* article features creative ways congregations are doing more to feed the hungry, including the use of blessing boxes. Stemming from a grassroots national movement, blessing boxes are appearing across the country on church property, accompanied by signs that read "Take What You Need" and "Bring What You Can." The boxes are an invitation for people to take whatever they need, with an emphasis on non-perishable food items such as canned tuna or boxes of

macaroni and cheese. They often also include toiletry items, school supplies and toilet tissue.

Congregations with blessing boxes usually stock them several times a week, often receiving assistance from others in the community. Many feel that the boxes offer a way for those in need to maintain their dignity while still having needs met. "One thing about the blessing box is that you have to let go of control of who takes from it and go prayerfully about the ministry," said the Rev. Lisa Reece of First Presbyterian Church in Bonham, Texas.
