## Stewardship Campaign

#### **Facilities Committee**

What do the tabernacle of Moses, the temple of Solomon, and First Presbyterian Church all have in common? Yes, although different in their form and function, they are all places of worship.

In service and by giving, a place of worship is lifted up by its congregation. We all share in the responsibility of being good stewards of the buildings, grounds, and furnishings. And all the services, programs, and activities are a testament to our commitment as a living community of faith. Your support of the stewardship campaign literally helps to keep the lights on around here as well as all the other utilities and a variety of other expenses.



With your support, the facilities committee is charged with:

- Overseeing the budget, maintenance, and improvements of the church buildings and church grounds. Over the last year, we've had roof repairs, brick work, and door repairs. We maintain a relatively complex heating and cooling system. We had the boiler replaced and the steeples will be painted soon. We schedule snow removal as needed and lawn care on an ongoing basis. Our aging incandescent and fluorescent lights are being replaced with high efficiency, LED lights. And we are looking into the possibility of making the carillon functional again.
- We schedule or perform periodic inspections of the buildings and grounds for maintenance, safety and security. This past year, we worked with other church committees and church staff to produce the church's first emergency response plan. The plan will be rolled out over the next couple months. This past week, weekday school staff began implementing the plan. We had Red Cross First Aid/CPR/AED training. Future trainings will include any church member that would like to get certified in First Aid/CPR and AED. We inspected the church's first aid kits, defibrillator, and the fire alarm system. We have a scheduled fire drill coming next week.
- We oversee the maintenance, use, registration, fuel, and state inspection of the church bus.
- We receive requests for purchasing furnishings and equipment. Recently, the church purchased a portable heater for the chapel and a portable sound system.

Preparing for fall, we are meeting weekly on **Wednesdays** from 5:00 to 6:00 PM and on **Community Breakfast**Saturdays from 9:30 to 11:00 AM, until further notice. With tropical storm Florence in mind, last week we cleaned out some of the gutters, downspouts, and drainage pipes. Last



Saturday, we replaced light bulbs and repaired and painted a damaged wall in the corridor outside the Fellowship Hall.

So, please support the stewardship campaign, and if you have any time or interest in helping with facilities, please do! You'll enjoy the fellowship and God provides everything else. Thank you!
