#### Why Stewardship?

Stewardship is not fundamentally about raising the church's budget. Stewardship is the faithful living out of God's claim over human life and the entire created order. The word "stewardship" simply means "oversight" and "responsibility for the use of" a resource that does not belong to oneself. Many of us live with the inner lie that what we own belongs to us. The truth of biblical faith is that everything that

exists in the universe was created by God and belongs to God. In God's lavish generosity we are provided with the means to provide for our families and ourselves. It is God's house we live in, God's church we administer.

Here is the bottom line: It is not our *stuff* we are talking about. It is our *hearts* that we are talking about and how much of them really belongs to God. In stewardship God asks the questions, "What are you doing with my stuff? And what does that say about our relationship?

For us in the Reformed family, gratitude is always our fundamental stance before God. When wonderful things happen, we are grateful for the gift of them. When grief or challenge happens, we are grateful for God's grace, comfort, and guidance. Gratitude is a way of being in the world that has the power to change us and ultimately redeem the world. Until the word "stewardship" can be reclaimed from its captivity to the one-month annual fund campaign, perhaps we could subsitute the word "gratitude." November is "Gratitude Month."



When you come to worship on Sunday mornings, have you ever noticed how everything is all ready for you? Whether it's something obvious like the music, seasonal decorations, or the communion table, or the small details such as the worship bulletins—everything is in its place. None of this happens without planning and discussion ahead of time, followed by carrying out those decisions at the right time. This is where your worship committee comes in. We are responsible for:

- Overseeing the worship services and the Children's Worship program
- Preparing and cleaning up Communion and Extended Table
- Preparing for the Sacrament of Baptism
- Cleaning up pews and restocking pew racks
- Scheduling of the sanctuary flowers
- Maintaining the altar candles
- Changing the paraments
- Scheduling liturgist and ushers
- Scheduling communion serving teams
- Maintenance and operation of the sound system, lighting and video recording during worship
- Overseeing the maintenance of Chrismon ornaments and displaying of Chrismon Tree
- Working with our Pastor and our Music Directors to plan all special services including Advent, Christmas, Lenten, Holy Week, Easter, World Communion Sunday, and Laity Sunday
- Confirming that the cash offering has been counted and secured
- Overseeing the music program of the church
- Securing supply pastors for worship services when needed

#### **Christian Education Committee**

This person will develop and implement ministry programs to meet the spiritual, social, and emotional needs of our youth and families, especially as it pertains to the areas of group building, worship, discipleship, mission, and outreach.

Your support for the Christian Education ministry of this church is crucial if we are to continue to grow spiritually as Christ's church. We need your prayers for all who are involved in the programs I have mentioned, and we need your prayers that the Holy Spirit will guide and direct all that we do.
