My dear Church family

In our American culture, we sometimes have a way of adding things to what was once a purely religious holy day and turning it into a sort of Hallmark Holiday. Now don't get me wrong, the Easter Bunny always made a stop at our house when our kids were young, and I love the movie, *Easter Parade*. Unfortunately, when we start adding secular layers to what is, at its heart, a sacred observance, the true meaning of the day becomes buried in the cultural clutter, and we miss out on the very best part.

Consider Jesus' disciples. The man they followed and believed to be the promised Messiah was dead. Dead, buried, gone. They were frightened, angry, confused, and grieving. They were hiding, lying low for fear they, too, might be arrested and killed. The women went to the tomb with spices for Jesus' body, but the tomb was empty. A heavenly messenger asked the women why they were seeking the living among the dead. Jesus, who was dead, had risen from the grave and was alive! The women ran to tell the disciples the good news, but, according to more than one Gospel, the disciples could not, would not believe until Jesus stood in their midst. In Jesus' presence, Easter burst upon them with the eternal, astounding, unfathomable, unconquerable love of God. These followers who had denied and abandoned Jesus, who had lost all hope and sense of purpose were suddenly filled with joy, peace, amazement, praise, and renewed conviction to serve their risen Lord. They went from feet of clay to hearts on fire.

It occurs to me that we, as a church family, have gone through our season of sorrow, grief, anger, fear, and confusion. It was a natural response to an event that caught us all off guard. However, in this season of Eastertide, it is time for us, like the disciples, to open our hearts and let Easter burst in upon us with the same overwhelming sense of God's love shown in Jesus Christ, allowing ourselves to experience Christ's resurrection personally and as a con-

gregation. As we choose to live as resurrection people, our faith and ministry becomes stronger, deeper, and more compelling. Our resurrected life has already begun. Just as surely as I see the signs of the earth's renewal in the buds, blossoms, and leaves of spring, I see the signs of renewal here in our congregation. Look and you will see it in the ministries of caring and sharing within and beyond our congregation, in our worship, in our fellowship, and in our commitment to serving Christ.

It is time for us to cast off all of those things that keep us from living and serving fully—fear, doubt, anger, mistrust, sorrow. If you have been hanging back, staying away, not getting involved, accept Christ's invitation to share in the good news of his resurrection. Accept the love, joy, laughter, and life that Christ offers each of us as part of his Body, the Church. Accept the family, fellowship, and opportunities for service and growth that Christ offers you through First Presbyterian Church.

Through Christ's birth, life, death, and resurrection, God has proclaimed an eternal "Yes!" to his creation. Respond to God's profound gift of love with a "Yes!" of your own. Open your hearts and arms to your brothers and sisters at First Presbyterian. Join in our shared ministry, so that we can spread the "Yes!" of Easter to our community and to the world.
