# Christian Education Opportunities

There are several opportunities for Adult Bible study and devotional studies in January.

During the **Sunday School hour** (9:45-10:40 Sunday mornings) there will be two classes.

First, a group facilitated by Lang Mauck will continue their study of *The Journey*, by Adam Hamilton. This is an Advent series that will continue through this season following Epiphany. This class meets in the Session Room.

A new seven-week study will begin on January 6 in the Irby classroom (across the hall from the Session Room). It will use a series called, *Keeping the Sabbath*, featuring reflections and discussion guides by Dorothy Bass, Walter Breuggemann and Carol Wehrheim. The first gathering on January 6th will be an introduction and materials will be distributed for future sessions at that meeting.

The Adult Sunday School classes will not meet on Sunday, January 26th due to the Annual Congregational Meeting.

The Sunday evening Bible Study group will resume meeting on Sunday evenings from 6:00-7:30pm starting on January 13th. For the months of January and February we will use a book by Brian Wren entitled, *Hymns for Today*, which explores foundational theological themes (Jesus, Spirit, Church, Worship, Witness, Praise, Treasure) through the art and poetry of hymns. Ordering a copy of the book is not required, but copies are available on Amazon for about \$12. The class meetings will pair hymn texts with scripture passages, and we will do some singing! (Yes, you can sing!) Come and join Pastor Jenny as she leads this study which is close to her heart.

# From the Bridge Pastor:

Most people, whether church-going or not, recognize the season of Christmas and the time of preparation and busy-ness that leads up to it (in the church we call that Advent). After the excitement and celebration of Christmas, what next? The poet Howard Thurman wrote,

When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home, When the shepherds are back with their flock, The work of Christmas begins.

In the church, we this is the season that follows Epiphany, a period of "Ordinary Time" preceding the beginning of Lent. It is anything but "ordinary" however. Though the celebration of Christmas is past, the "work" of Christ-with-us is just begun! And in the season of Epiphany we celebrate God's ongoing gift of light, sight, and vision that brings us revelation and direction and purpose!

General Assembly Committee on Representation member Rev. Rubén Ortiz Rodríguez shares the following reflection: "in our life epiphany moments occur when our thinking discovers a truth that so far had not been realized. But, for this to happen we can't be content with what we know or limit our experiences to what we are used to. The Biblical story tells us how men and women relate many of those moments when they discovered at some point in their lives how God revealed God's plan and work. Those moments of epiphany transformed their thinking and how they interpreted their life's circumstances. Thus, under this new revelation and insight, they transformed the world in which they lived. In our personal and ecclesial experience, how have we discovered those moments of revelation and insight? How we have transformed the way we think and live? How we have impacted the world in this time in which we live?"

During this season in which we greet the new year, let us be open to the new revelation, new direction, new calling that God is opening up in our midst here at FPC. There will be much to come in this year of 2014, especially as we anticipate the arrival the new pastor. Let us continue to be in prayer for the Pastor Nominating Committee, for the elders and leaders who currently serve, and for those who will serve. Thanks be to God!

#### Facilities Committee

At the Session meeting in August, the discussion began about securing our building more effectively. This was due to finding strangers in the building during work hours and while our Weekday School was in session. The Facilities Committee was asked to get quotes on locking the building during work hours while allowing a way for those with legitimate reasons to enter.

The Session authorized the installation of a closed circuit camera outside the weekday school entrance and put a keypad at that door and the choir room outside door. These doors and all outside entry doors will remain locked during the day for the safety of the staff and our weekday school children.

At the November Session meeting it was decided that the rear carport entrance and the

choir room doors would allow entry only by a keypad activated with a number code or a fob. Keys will no longer work on those two doors and should be returned to the office.



Anyone needing access will be issued a key fob to open the door. There will be a \$5 deposit requested to insure return of the fob when it is no longer needed. If you need a fob, please see Smith Chaney or Nancy Moore..

A special thank-you goes to Smith who installed the keypads and the security camera. The intent of this action, above all else, is for the security of our children and our staff.

# **Session Highlights**

November 25, 2013

- · Jenny Spivey moderated the meeting which began at 7 pm.
- · Pearl Minter gave the devotion and opened with prayer.
- The Session accepted the resignation of Harold Lamm as moderator of the Facilities Committee; Nancy Moore will assume this position until a new elder is installed.
- · The Session approved up to \$5000 to complete the security system work already underway.
- · Memorial gifts from Margaret Hotchkiss and Bunny O'Neal were received.
- · It was reported that total pledges for 2014 received to-date amount to \$239,756, representing 85 pledging units so far against 105 units for 2013. It was also reported that if the additional pledging united from whom we have not yet heard were to pledge the same amount as in 2013, we could surpass this year's \$330, 858 by nearly \$10,000.
- · A policy was approved for receiving and handling bequests and memorial gifts to the church. Procedures will be placed in the Manual of Operations.
- · The Session approved the hiring of an additional Weekday School aide due to increased enrollment.
- · Joan Montgomery was elected as Clerk through August 2014. Milt Davis was elected as Treasurer through August 2014.
- · The meeting was adjourned with prayer by the moderator
