From My Perspective Within The Kingdom

I am really enjoying our Combined Adult Sunday School class this summer as we work our way through the book, *Reformed Worship*, by Howard L. Rice and James C. Huffstutler. While I was preparing to teach the fourth chapter on the Sacrament of Baptism for Sunday, June 26, 2011, I came upon this story and I thought it was worth sharing with you.

Nanette Sawyer, who is the founding pastor of Wicker Park Grace in Chicago, which is a missional faith community of the Presbyterian Church USA, tells about her baptism as an adult. She writes: Then it was my turn to sing, as was the tradition in our church, everyone who was old enough to sing at his or her baptism sang "I have decided to follow Jesus." I began to sing. As I looked out at the faces of those who had welcomed and loved me to this moment, I knew that I was being embraced into community – not only into this community, but also into a larger community of faith, one that stretched back into history and into the future. As I sang... I was overcome by the magnitude of what was happening. My voice began to tremble and crack as I sang, "I have decided..." The congregation was right there. The people began to hum when my voice grew weak. They came in under me, lifting me up, and supporting me.... I began to cry and my voice broke. Again the community was there to put words to the humming and to my crying. "We have decided to follow Jesus, we have decided to follow Jesus. No turning back. No turning back." They sang for me when I couldn't sing. They sang while I healed, and after a while I could sing again. That is what we do for each other. That is what it means to be the body of Christ and baptized into it by the Holy Spirit of a Creator God. We sing for each other. (*Christian Century*, June 14, 2011, page 20)

We sing for each other. We help one another. We bear one another's burdens, and in this way we fulfill the law - "to love one another" - of Christ (see Galatians 6:2). This, in part, is the meaning of baptism. We are church. There, we love one another, support each other, and are accountable to our Lord as well as our sisters and our brothers in the faith.

I have shared with you before how, just prior to my ordination and installation as pastor in my first church, I met with the retired pastor, who had baptized me as a baby. In the course of our conversation, I asked Dr. Smylie if I could see the entry of my baptism in his ministerial record book. I watched as he flipped through a number of pages until his finger came to rest on a certain line and he read aloud: "Randall Clair Stevens, son of Clair and Connie Stevens, born July 14, 1950, and baptized on October 15, 1950." While I don't remember that event at all, nevertheless, I was greatly moved by the very fact of God's love vividly expressed to me through the love and nurture of my home church. They sang for me. They told me the stories of the Bible. They helped me to grow as a disciple of Jesus. They encouraged me as I sought to follow God's will for my life. And, they surrounded Monica and me with their love and joy when we married in that church in January of 1975.

Let us remember that we are baptized into a holy covenant with God and with God's family. Let us continue to be there for each other, to celebrate the joys and uphold one another in the difficult times. And, if necessary, let us sing for each other. After all, when we love and support one another, surely that must be music to God's ears!
