From My Perspective Within The Kingdom

In the very first page of the Bible, when God created the heavens and the earth, the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible translates Genesis 1:2 by stating: "The earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God (or the Spirit of God) swept over the face of the waters." However, I prefer the translation, which renders the Hebrew into English by stating that "... the Spirit of God brooded over the waters." In fact, Eugene H. Peterson translates Genesis 1:2 in this fashion: "Earth was a soup of nothingness, a bottomless emptiness, an inky blackness. God's Spirit brooded like a bird above the watery abyss" (The Message, p. 20).

I like that rich imagery of God's spirit brooding over the creation much like a mother hen brooding over her eggs waiting for them to hatch. That image really resonates with me because I have this strong sense of the Spirit of God brooding over our congregation and certain events have begun to hatch!

After months of planning, *The Magnetic Church* conference, which was led by Andy Weeks, became a reality in February. About 50 of our members, along with some other friends and guests, attended this event; and, according to the evaluations, it was a big success. Andy Weeks came here and helped us to look at ourselves from a totally different perspective – not as the pastor or church member, who knows how to find his/her way around the church's facility but as a first-time visitor trying to locate the church office, the restroom facilities, or the sanctuary. And, if one is a non-churched person, who has had little or no experience inside any church, words like "narthex, sanctuary, or chancel" may have no meaning at all. We talked about how to greet visitors, our signs (or lack thereof), and how to market the church so that we are more "visitor-friendly" to folks who don't know much about us. It was a worthwhile weekend and, as a result, we will become a more welcoming church.

Plans are underway for our four Sundays in March. The last Sunday in February we will distribute flyers to the 300+ homes in the surrounding neighborhoods and invite our neighbors to come and join us for breakfast at either 8:00-8:30 a.m. or 10:20-10:50 a.m. and then attend one of the worship services if they so desire. The invitation is also being extended to family members and friends as well as church members, who have drifted away over time. It will be exciting to see where the Spirit is leading us in this new venture of faith.

It is always a personal privilege of mine as pastor of the church to spend quality time with the young people in the Confirmation Class and share with them the Christian faith from a Presbyterian perspective. I have begun to meet with Stuart Beard, Annie B. Boyd, Dyer Pace, William Seamon, and Mary Catherine Stegall, and we will be meeting until the end of April when they will be given the opportunity to meet with the Session and make a profession of faith and formally join the church on Pentecost Sunday, May 23. Please join with me in praying for these young disciples.

These are just a few of the activities that are beginning to hatch and grow under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. It's an exciting time to be at the First Presbyterian Church of Martinsville, VA. I hope you agree!

On Palm Sunday, March 28, and Easter Sunday, April 4, we will receive the annual *One Great Hour of Sharing Offering*. The purpose of this offering is to meet human needs and is administered through three programs of the Presbyterian Church (USA): the Presbyterian Hunger program, Presbyterian World Service, and the Self Development of People. Please give generously to this offering which is a witness to the unity to which Christ calls us.

Join us for our Lenten suppers and worship services! We begin eating at 5:45 p.m. with worship at 6:20 p.m. Remaining speakers are Rusty Reaser (March 3), Hank Baumann (March 10), Bob Button (March 17), Randy Stevens (March 24). Call the Church Office to make reservations for the suppers. On April 1, Maundy Thursday (when Jesus shared the Last Supper with his disciples in the upper room) we will

have a covered dish supper at 5:30 in the fellowship hall, and everyone is encouraged to bring a favorite casserole or special dish, and a dessert to share with others. We will then move upstairs to the sanctuary for the worship- service at 7:00 p.m. During worship we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper by intinction--people will come forward to the Table to sup by taking the bread and dipping it in the juice, and then they will return to their pews. If you prefer, you can either receive communion from the bread and juice trays on the front Table or an elder can serve you the communion elements in your pew.

Palm Sunday is March 28, the day when we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Our community holds an annual Palm Sunday in the park worship service, where a group of churches in the area walk to Wilson Park for a brief ecumenical worship service. We will meet in the narthex of the sanctuary at 9:30 a.m. that Sunday morning to walk as a group to the park. All Sunday school classes that day will be cancelled.

Good Friday Worship Service will be held at noon, on A0ril 2, in our sanctuary. Once again, the service will focus on the Seven Last Words of Christ from the cross. Various hymns and prayers will be interspersed throughout the service. Preaching at this service will be Hank Baumann. fellowship among our members and will allow you to meet and greet any visitors to the Church in a casual setting. Darla Main-Schneider of Rising Sun Breads will be catering the breakfasts each Sunday, so please come for great food and fellowship.

News from Operation Christmas Child

Many thanks to all of you who helped pack Operation Christmas Child boxes at last November's Advent Workshop. Samaritan's Purse has just informed me that our boxes went to Togo. Togo is a long, narrow country in West Africa between Ghana and Benin, with just 32 miles of coastline on the Gulf of Guinea. Although there are sizeable Christian and Muslim minorities, most of the people follow native animist beliefs and do not know Jesus. Most of the people make a living through small farms in a dry, tropical climate. About half the population lives below the poverty line. Samaritan's Purse has been distributing OCC boxes in Togo since 1997, for a total of about 390,000. Each box brings a child and family the Good News of God's love through Jesus Christ.

From Your Stewardship/Visioning Committee

The Session's Stewardship/Visioning Committee, among other responsibilities, is charged to plan not just for our annual stewardship season, but also to make us all aware of ways in which we might act to strengthen our Church's long-term future and the better fulfillment of its mission, which might be described as stewardship of our capital. To that end, it completed work in 2009 on a brochure containing information about the Church's existing endowment funds and methods by which interested individuals or couples might seek to increase them. That brochure was approved by the Session last year and is available on request. A call to Sarah Altizer or Nancy Erikson at the church office is all you need to do to get one sent to you right away.

The Committee proposes in future issues of Steeple Views to continue to highlight this important subject. Those who have thought about it and then done something in response have been motivated by a love for the Church and a desire to make an enduring gift to promote its mission and wellbeing. Perhaps you have seen an ad on Public TV seeking endowment gifts which quotes one donor as feeling that her gift has made her feel that she has made herself a tiny bit immortal. Of course we don't see it exactly that way theologically speaking, but this sentiment speaks to a common desire among people of good will to do something with their lives and their possessions to make the world a better place.

Here's a way you might want to consider, if appropriate to your own circumstances, to leave First Presbyterian a stronger and better servant of God's mission – naming it as a potential beneficiary of an IRA or similar retirement account. What this would mean is that, if there were any remaining funds in such an account following your death and, if applicable, the death of your principal beneficiary (usually a surviving spouse), those

funds would be distributed to the Church. What's so great about this? Well, individual beneficiaries who might otherwise receive these funds must treat them as taxable income and of course have to pay income taxes on any amounts received. The Church, being a qualified charitable religious organization, can receive the funds in full without being subject to income tax liability for them. It also is a gift of financial resources which didn't turn out to be needed. Is this idea worth thinking about? Only you can decide and act on it.

Of course the disclaimer: You should rely upon your own trusted adviser before acting on this idea. The Committee, of course, cannot offer you tax or other legal advice, just information for you to look into further if you're interested.
