In the Wilderness

The season of Lent began recently with the observance of Ash Wednesday. Lent is a season that stretches for forty days (not including Sundays) through Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and takes us all the way to the tomb – and the victory of Easter morning! As we joined with our brothers and sisters in Christ at Broad Street Christian Church for worship on Ash Wednesday, many of us were marked with a sign of the cross in ashes, a reminder of our mortality and sign of repentance. The words that were spoken upon receiving ashes, "Repent and believe the good news," are the same words that John the Baptist proclaimed as he baptized in the River Jordan. The forty-day Lenten journey recalls the time Jesus spent in the wilderness directly following his baptism by John, a time of fasting, testing, and temptation. But let us remember this: Jesus' experience in the wilderness came only after God had spoken and called him the "beloved Son."

There are many experiences in our own lives that feel like wilderness experiences. Perhaps you have felt that way upon moving to a new place, going off to college, starting or ending a job, or at the death of a loved one. This time in the life of our congregation may too feel like a wilderness experience, in which we are tested, as we seek to continue our faithful witness in changing circumstances. So, let us too remember, we have been claimed and called beloved children of God in our own baptisms. The same Spirit that rested on Christ now abides with the church, giving us strength in what seem to be our weakest moments. So, let us walk together through the wilderness of Lent with humble and open hearts, that we might meet again our Lord Jesus who endured and suffered, yes, but who also was raised to assure of our everlasting hope. Thanks be to God.

Interim Pastor Search Committee Update

The members of the Interim Pastor Search Committee are Nancy Baker, Kim Boyd, Duke Ferrell, David Price and Forrest Truitt. The committee has completed the Church Information Form (CIF), a document giving a representative description of First Presbyterian Church, Martinsville, and the skills and characteristics being sought in an interim pastor. The CIF has been reviewed and approved by the Session of First Presbyterian Church and the Committee on Ministry of Presbytery of the Peaks.

The information contained in our CIF was input into a national personnel matching system maintained by PC(USA) and the committee has since received Personal Information Forms (akin to a pastor's resumé) from over 30 interim pastor candidates. After a period of examination and evaluation of these PIFs, the members of the Interim Pastor Search Committee agreed to evaluate further eight of the potential interim pastor candidates.

Please be in prayer for the members of this committee that they may be guided by the Holy Spirit as they seek to discern the interim pastor God has chosen for First Presbyterian of Martinsville.

Joint Lenten Series

This year during Lent, we will again be joining together with Christ Episcopal, St. Paul Episcopal, Holy Trinity Lutheran, Broad Street Christian and Forest Hills Presbyterian Churches to have a joint Lenten series. These programs will be similar to our past Kirk Night Lent gatherings, with devotion and supper.

The theme for this year's series will be the *Lord's Prayer* and each evening we will focus on one of the petitions of that prayer and how we can live out that aspect of faith in our community today.

The schedule each Wednesday will be:

Holy Week and Easter Worship

The observance of Holy Week begins with **Palm Sunday** on **April 1**, marking Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We will have our normal worship services at 8:35 and 11:00a.m. in our sanctuary that morning. At 10:00 we will again join with other local churches for the *Palm Sunday in the Park* service. Meet in the narthex at 9:45 a.m. to walk over to that joint service together. On **Maundy Thursday, April 5**, we will have a congregational meal in the Fellowship Hall at 5:30 p.m., followed by 7:00 p.m. Worship service, and we will

welcome several guest preachers to reflect on the last words of Christ from the cross. On **Easter Sunday**, **April 8**, we will



have our TWO worship services at 8:35 and 11:00 a.m. Everyone is also invited to our traditional **Easter Breakfast at 9:30 a.m.** in the Fellowship Hall, followed by the children's **Easter Egg Hunt at 10:15 a.m.** on the playground.

Theological Vision Statement

Collections of psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs give voice to the church's core beliefs and theological convictions. Their texts are "compact theology," and the selection of hymns and songs (both the themes that are emphasized and those that are overlooked), the order in which they are presented, and even the ways they are indexed shape the theological thinking and ultimately the faith and practices of the church.

Previous hymnals have responded to the needs of the church and the world by highlighting the rhythms of the church year, the centrality of the Psalms in the prayer and praise of Reformed churches, the corporate witness of the church to the world, the seeking of God's peace and God's justice, and the rich musical and poetic resources of world Christianity. All these motifs remain important and should be retained, in one way or another, in this collection.

The next Presbyterian collection of hymns and songs, however, will be pub-

lished amid different conditions than those that molded previous ones. It will be offered in a world in which trust in human progress has been undermined and eclectic spiritualities often fail to satisfy deed spiritual hungers. It will be used by a church many of whose members have not had lifelong formation by Scripture and basic Christian doctrine, much less Reformed theology. It is meant for a church marked by growing diversity in liturgical practice. Moreover, it addresses a church divided by conflicts but nonetheless, we believe, longing for healing and the peace that is beyond understanding.

To inspire and embolden a church facing these formidable challenges, the overarching theme of the collection will be God's powerful acts of creation, redemption, and final transformation. It will also bespeak the human responses that God's gracious acts make possible. In other words, the framework for this collection of congregational song will be the history of salvation.
