Devotional Meditation Elder, Dr. Denny Casey Week of April 17, 2022

O Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures. Psalm 104:24

As the weather turns warmer, I've had the pleasure of spending more time outdoors and hiking some of the nearby trails. Over the last few weeks, I've marveled at how the forest's browns and grays have turned to a variety of shades of green - those special spring-time greens that signal new life, "Nature's first green is gold" as Robert Frost put it. Red bud and dogwood blossoms splash in beautiful shades of lavender, pink and white along the path as returning songbirds enthusiastically herald the coming of spring. Passing by a stream alongside the trail, it seems to brim in delight as the ripples of rushing water from a recent shower dance over the rounded rocks. I'm reminded of how great and wonderous God's creation truly is and I'm reminded of this psalm.

The psalmist (Psalm 104:24) having taken notice of the diversity of the works of creation, stops and wonders at the sheer number; and not only the quantity but the quality of the works; put simply, 'how great are thy works!' There is such an amazing abundance in the majesty and power of God, and beauty surrounds us and blesses us with serenity, comfort, and increased appreciation.

Everything in nature is wisely designed and made. You don't have to look far to see, there is such a glorious display of God's wisdom - from the tiniest insect to the largest whale. Oh, the things his hands have made!

When God had finished his works of creation, and looked over them, he declared it as good, and God gave human beings dominion over nature. The term "dominion" doesn't mean to dominate or to take over by force, rather dominion is better understood as a careful responsibility to nurture, to care for, the same responsibility God exercises in taking care of us – with compassion and loving direction as a parent looks after a child. We are called to be good stewards of the earth and all of creation. With that responsibility comes wisdom. What misguided, arrogant, and ignorant creatures we must be if we carelessly destroy or exploit any of the works of God with selfish greed or by dismissing wisdom.

Lest we forget, the Lord is the maker and keeper of heaven and earth, and all that is in them and whatever of the riches and good things of the earth we may enjoy, we are only stewards. We need to ask ourselves if we are showing God due respect and reverence in all we do.

All that we are and have belongs to God. We may realize the true value of "all that we are and have" through careful stewardship of God's creation. Stewardship as a way of life lived from the graciousness of God. In gratitude to God and with care for humanity and nature, we seek to live as Christian people in response to the renewal of all creation that God has begun in Jesus Christ.

This Friday, April 22, marks the 52nd anniversary of Earth Day, and I encourage everyone to become involved in some way to help protect God's creation. Take up a project at home to reduce or recycle packaging from the kitchen. Combine trips to the market and errands to reduce gas. Turn off lights that are not in use. Check wasteful thermostat settings. Mulch grass clippings and plant native, non-invasive plants in the yard. Buy locally sourced, organic groceries. Support the congregation's call as an Earth Care Congregation. Creation care can involve all ages and can be a ministry that we, as a concerned congregation, will pass on to our children... something practical and fun too...with profound implications for the life, service, and witness of God's people.

This week, as we affirm our commitment to God's creation, we can celebrate and rededicate ourselves to work together toward a happier, healthier, and a greener 2022 Earth Day!

Prayer

Creator God, you made the earth and declared it good. Show us our place in your creation that we may care for the beauty of the earth and work together to face climate change head-on and for cleaner air and purer water in our streams and lakes. Make us resurrection people who bring your renewal to the world. Breathe your Spirit on us that we may share your healing presence with all people and all creatures. Raise us up as signs of new life for your coming reign, through Christ we pray. Amen.
