Devotional Meditation Elder Monica Stevens January 6, 2022

Epiphany

Isaiah 60:1-6, Matthew 2:1-12

When we encounter the word "epiphany," probably a couple of meanings come to mind. One meaning is that "Aha!" moment when something suddenly becomes clear in a flash of insight and the other is that liturgical season that occurs on the heels of Christmas. Both have relevance today.

The liturgical season of Epiphany marks the Biblical account of the magi seeking, finding, and worshipping the Christ child. These visitors from the east were guided to the manger by the light of a star. The star led them to Judea, but they had to stop and ask directions from Herod. They most likely believed the child would be part of the royal court. However, Herod was unaware of this possible threat to his rule, so he called on his Jewish scholars, who, using the prophecy from Micah, determined that Bethlehem was the site of the birth. Herod had an epiphany of his own, that instead of leading him into God's presence, led him to decide he could use these unsuspecting magi to locate and then eliminate the potential usurper. Following the directions and the star, the magi completed their mission, and enlightened by a dream, left by another way without reporting back to Herod.

Many times we think of the arrival of the magi as the end of the end of the Nativity play acted out on Christmas Eve, but it is so much more. God placed a heavenly invitation in the night sky that prompted and guided three outsiders (non-Jewish folk) to seek the newborn king of the Jews.

By calling and including the magi as witnesses to the birth of Jesus, God revealed himself and proclaimed that his salvation was meant for the entire world. This newborn baby, God's own incarnation, would provide the means for all people in all times and places to experience God's saving grace and become one as God's beloved children. I think we have lived in the knowledge of God's grace extended to all humankind for so long that we take it for granted, but there was a time in history when anyone outside of the Jewish faith was largely ignorant of the one true

God. The star in the sky and the presence of the magi at the manger were the beginning of humankind's great epiphany, our "Aha!" moment spread out for eternity, that welcomed us into the presence and family of God through Jesus, the Christ.

You may have noticed that I cited Isaiah 60:1-6 as one of the scriptures for today. The first three verses say:

Arise, shine; for your light has come,

And the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. ...

For darkness shall cover the earth,

And thick darkness the peoples;

But the Lord will arise upon you,

And his glory will appear over you.

Nations shall come to your light,

And kings to the brightness of your dawn.

This well- known scripture helps us to understand that while the Epiphany with the star and the magi happened at a particular point in history, the light of God's gift of "Aha" moments when we encounter God's presence and enlightenment are still occurring. God reaches out to us on a daily basis, and as the scripture says in verse 4, we need to "lift up our eyes and look around" to see what God is doing.

May this verse from a hymn we sang on Sunday be our prayer:

As with gladness men of old did the guiding star behold; As with joy they hailed its light, leading onward, beaming bright; So most gracious Lord, may we evermore be led to Thee. Amen.

The church office will open for limited appointments. Please call to schedule. Please enter at the narthex for Sunday worship and during the week use the back door at the portico.


