The Pentecost Offering unites us in a church-wide effort to support young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world.

A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children. 40% of the Pentecost offering can be

retained by individual congregations wanting to make an impact in the lives of young people within their own community. The remaining 60% is used to support children-at-risk, youth, and young adults through ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

Parents and their youth -- BOTH -- need mental health support and a great sense of caring from our community. I believe the more that we can "Show" this to parents/ guardians and youth (combined) in our community in all facets - church, schools, private and non-profit sector...the safer and healthier we can become. However -- the "best" news is (saving the best for last:), this generation of young people are so much more accepting of mental health support, awareness and destigmatization.
